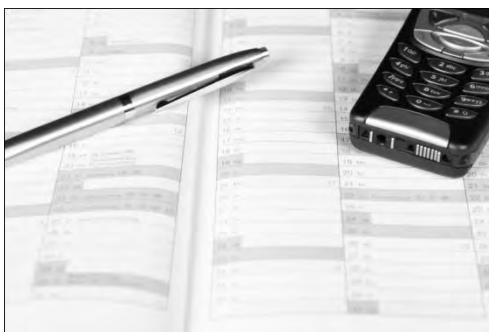

2010 Master Gardener Classes - Thanks to the volunteer efforts of many, the 2010 Master Gardener Class program has begun. Penny Barton, Howard Fennimore, Jan Griffiths, Lynn Pietz and Becky Reynolds participated in the interview and selection process which gave us a nice class size of 20 students. The kick-off orientation for the class was held on January 28th with a group of Certified

Master Gardeners providing the food and event sponsors speaking about their projects. This was led by Ann Warwick.

Once again Certified Master Gardeners are allowed to audit the MG classes. There is a maximum five audit seats available per class. You should have received a class syllabus and a request for class attendance from Patti Speelmon. She assigned CMGs to classes based on your list of priorities and redistributed the results. If you cannot make a class that you have been assigned to please let Patti know so that she can update the list and notify individuals who may be interested in attending that class. Mike Bauer has recommended that if you are interested in a class that is full, you are welcome to show up the morning of the class because frequently not all five audit seats are taken. However if the five seats are taken you will not be able to stay for the class. Finally, when you are auditing a class be aware that the chairs at the tables are reserved for the students and we ask that you sit in chairs on the periphery of the classroom.

Home Horticulture Classes – Don Childress, Janae Dale and Gail Swan have once again put together a top program for our Spring Home Horticulture Series. The classes begin in late March and continue into May. Their dedication to bringing quality programs to the community is an important contributor to our mission of education. Thank you for all you do!

Advanced Master Gardener Classes – Janae Dale is passionate about bringing gardening knowledge to the membership and to the community. She has volunteered to chair the Advanced Master Gardener Classes and has some exciting, innovative ideas both for the short and long term. MG Home Visits – Last year Valle Novak, while giving an historical overview of the association, reported that the Master Gardeners used to meet periodically at member homes. That discussion kicked off a handful of MG home visits last year. We have decided to make it an annual event. 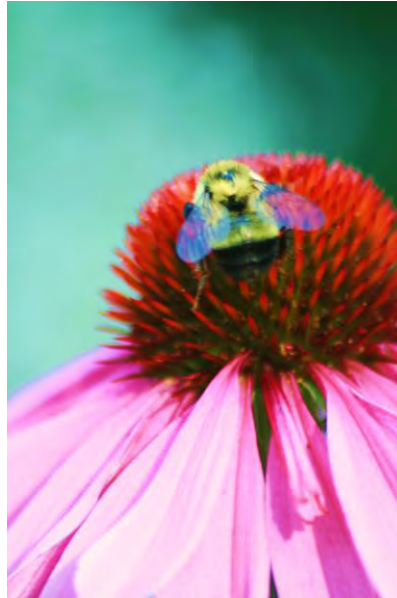

Agent's Corner



Spring is Getting Closer!

This mild winter of ours has had the feeling of spring in the air this past week. I am hoping it gets a little colder so our favorite plants aren't fooled too early.

Thanks to all of you who have stepped up this year while we are short-handed here in the Extension office. Patti is now our only administrative support for several programs, and your help is most appreciated.

In the February meeting of the Bonner County Master Gardener Association, we had a discussion on the recent and coming changes within the University of Idaho Extension. As you are probably aware, we have been dealing with budget cuts amounting to 22% in the current and coming year's budgets. The fact that 90% of Extension's budget is personnel costs spells future layoffs.

Last week, all program areas were asked to justify their programs. My understanding is that no program will be protected from the possibility of elimination. Extension administration will look at all programs to determine which ones are cut. Programs that have the most educational impact will be spared.

I mention this not to instill fear, but to ask for your continued commitment to educational outreach to the residents of Bonner County. This includes continuing with your current activities and innovative new programs, but also recording your activities so that I can report those impacts to those who fund our programs.

I will keep you updated as decisions are made. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Advanced Master Gardener classes for 2010 include a Plant Identification class, being taught by Jennifer Costich-Thompson, a special "pick-me-up" Problem Solving and Plant Clinic Review presented by Mike Bauer and Martha Fortunati, and a presentation by guest speaker, Dr. Linda Chalker-Scott, author of *The Informed Gardener* and *The Informed Gardener Blooms Again*.

Plant Identification will be a series of six or seven classes covering various families of plants, with Jennifer to guide the students through a much more intense program than what can be offered in the first year training. The dates of the classes are: April 2, April 16, April 30, May 7, May 14, June 4, and possibly June 18, from 9 am to noon. The class is limited in size, and is already full, but Jennifer has suggested she may do it again next year, if there is enough interest.

The Problem Solving and Plant Clinic Review is just the thing for everyone who works in the plant clinic to get brushed up on techniques and procedures. After taking this class you will look forward to your Plant Clinic time with confidence, better able to meet the needs of our clients. A date has not been set yet.

In May, Dr. Linda Chalker Scott will be here for an evening presentation at the auditorium in the Panhandle State Bank building. **She will speak on horticulture myths and using research to answer gardening questions.** We are very fortunate to have her coming here.

Other possible classes are being considered for later in the year.

Master Gardeners Support Edible Schoolyard

With a large group in attendance, enthusiasm was very high at the February Master Gardener Membership Meeting when Gail Burkett asked the Board if volunteer hours could be sanctioned for the Edible Schoolyard project at Northside School in the Selle Valley north of Sandpoint. The vote was unanimous for supporting community service hours at the school garden.

Northside is an elementary school at the Colburn-Culver and Rapid Lightening Road intersection where 180 students attend K-6th grade. This Edible Schoolyard after-school project will support a Garden Club open to 25 students who want to learn to grow food and will meet every single Monday, year round, except major holidays. Gail, along with parents and teacher volunteers, now ask the Master Gardeners to please consider what they love most about growing food and step up for an occasional

- Wheel barrow
- Planting flats
- Watering cans
- 100' hose for container watering
- Regular size Buckets
- Small Gloves
- Black Plastic (Weed & Heat)
- Shovels, large and small
- Very well composted manure
- Vegetable seeds
- We will probably have to buy soil amendments like azomite, organic nutrients, and deer deterrent Liquid Fence brand.
